

**Selwyn Cudjoe** is Margaret E. Deffenbaugh and LeRoy T. Carlson Professor of Comparative Literature and Professor of Africana Studies at Wellesley College. From 1995-1999 he was the fourth Marion Butler McLean Chair in the History of Ideas at Wellesley. He has published extensively on Caribbean literature and history including books on AFR Webber and the Making of the Guyanese Nation (2009), *The Intellectual Tradition of Trinidad and Tobago in the Nineteenth Century* (2003), *V.S. Naipaul: A Materialist Reading* (1988) and *Resistance and Caribbean Literature* (1978).

During his visit to the UCL Institute of the Americas he will be working on a political and social history centred on one of Trinidad and Tobago's largest plantation owners.
