National Environmental Crime Conference

The Bridging-the-Gaps award allocated to Dr Borrion (Jill Dando Institute of Crime Science) and Dr Emes (Centre for Advanced Instrumentation Systems) contributed to the development of the first National Environmental Crime Conference, in partnership with the Environment Institute and the Centre for Environmental Laws at UCL.

This event was held in October 2008 and brought together multi-disciplinary academic expertise with practitioners and policy-makers to discuss a range of current and future eco-crime problems such as wildlife crime, industrial pollution and illegal waste disposal.

Future

The Environment Agency has confirmed their support to UCL's initiative by sponsoring the second edition of the conference, to be held on 28th October 2009 in London. The event will become the annual showcase for environmental crime initiatives in the UK, and act as a platform to develop a coherent research agenda for reducing the threat that eco-crime poses to national and local communities.
