## Call for Proposals

You are warmly invited to submit a proposal to contribute to the 2014 UCL Teaching and Learning Conference by giving a presentation, leading a workshop or presenting a poster. A key theme of the conference will be how we can inspire students with research-based education. This includes not only their being taught by our world-leading researchers, but also creating opportunities for students to engage in research-like activities, as well as underpinning our teaching practice with evidence from educational research.

Proposals addressing all areas of teaching and learning are welcome. We are particularly interested to hear about in-house developments of curricula, teaching practices and infrastructure to support and enhance teaching, learning and/or assessment, as well as the wider student experience.



Submissions could come from, but are not limited to, these areas:

- Research-based learning
- Engaging and motivating students in their learning and development
- Creating opportunities for students to work in partnership with staff
- Enabling students to work together in investigative teams
- Supporting student progression throughout a degree programme
- Research-like approaches to assessment, e.g. student conferences, peer review
- Providing timely and effective feedback to large groups of students
- Ways of organising and managing large programmes
- Embedding new technologies into the curriculum to enhance students' digital literacy

### Submission guidelines

We welcome submissions from all UCL staff and students.

Submissions may take the form of proposals for presentations, posters, workshops or working papers. Presentations will be 10 minutes long, with 5 minutes for questions. Workshops will typically last for 60 minutes and include opportunities for their participants to exchange ideas or discuss and obtain feedback on working papers. We will invite the authors of posters to give a short 'elevator pitch' as a precursor to informal viewing and discussion of posters.

Please submit at <http://tinyurl.com/caltcfp> providing a 250 word abstract, with a title, an outline of the topic (including methods and findings where appropriate) and, for workshops, an indication of how you will engage participants in interaction.
