The MA induction sessions, lasting approximately two hours, will be followed by drinks in the English Department student common room (FC 229 on the second floor of Foster Court), to which tutors and students on all the Department's MA courses are invited.

Please keep this schedule for reference. Full teaching will begin on Monday 30<sup>th</sup> September.
