

The Hazlitt Society grew out of the project to restore Hazlitt's long-neglected grave in St Anne's churchyard, Soho. The committee which was formed for the purpose of the restoration established the Society to encourage appreciation of Hazlitt's work and values. The Society depends on the generosity of its members to pursue these goals through its activity.

In recent years there has been a free annual lecture by an established Hazlitt scholar or public intellectual at Conway Hall, London WC1, on the Saturday nearest 18th September, the day Hazlitt died. The Society has also been closely involved with the Hazlitt Day Schools which have taken place at St Catherine's College, Oxford, and University College London. These events provide an opportunity for students of Romantic literature and general readers alike to meet and to discuss their interest in Hazlitt.

A newsletter, sent out in the Spring or early Summer of each year alerts members of the Society to the lecture, day school, and any other events that may be of interest to admirers of Hazlitt.

The Hazlitt Review, launched in September 2008, is an annual journal which aims to foster and sustain Hazlitt's standing among the latest and most significant developments in the present-day study of the Romantic era. It is distributed at the lecture or sent to members free of charge by post.
