Windsor and Williamsfield Inventory of Slaves 1814

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Notes

Document has 4 parts, written recto and verso across 5 folios. Words in brackets are from Bodleian handlist of items:

- 1. An inventory and valuation of enslaved persons at Windsor Estate, St. Elizabeth parish, Jamaica, 1814 ('bundle 15, Inventory of Slaves 1814', pp 1-5).
- 2. An inventory and valuation of enslaved persons at Williamsfield settlement, St Elisabeth parish, Jamaica, 1814 ('bundle 15, Inventory of Slaves 1814', p.6)
- 3. An inventory of animals at Windsor Estate, St Elizabeth parish, Jamaica, 1814 ('bundle 15, Inventory of Slaves 1814', p.7)
- 4. A cover note outlining the contents of the document ('bundle 15, Inventory of Slaves 1814', p.8)

All inventories are dated 1st April 1814.

Windsor and Williamsfield (if latter is correctly identified) are 25.5km (15.8 miles) distant. It is possible the inventories were undertaken on the same day, but it is also possible that both were simply written up on that day.

All the documents are identified with 'John Blyth' and 'John R Webb'. Blyth may be identified with John Blyth, attorney of Jamaica. Webb may be identified as John Racker Webb, plantation owner and attorney of Foster Barham family's Mesopotamia plantation.² It is likely the third was also completed by Blyth and Webb.

'Do' is an abbreviation of 'ditto', i.e. the same as before/above.
