Programme structure

Students take six core and two optional modules. In addition, students undertake a research project on a business issue culminating in a 15,000 word report.

The programme is based on four main themes:

- **Management from outside in**
Analysis of business economics, global competition and markets provide an understanding and tools for analysing market demand and customers in a constantly changing world
- **Management from inside out**
Focus on organisational behaviour and decision-making provides the skills to analyse and contribute to organisations that are successful in responding to customer needs and motivating their own people
- **Analytical and business skills**
Study of decision-making, accounting and finance provide students with knowledge and skills that are essential for running organisations in an effective and efficient way
- **Leadership and professional development**
Training in leadership and communication, together with workshops on professional development, enable students to develop knowledge and skills needed to take up leadership roles.

Teaching is delivered through a combination of lectures, seminars, and class discussion. Courses are assessed by presentations, coursework, class participation, open-book and unseen examinations.



Programme information

The Management MSc is a conversion degree designed to equip students with a first degree in a non-management or non-business subject with knowledge and understanding of business and organisations. The programme can be taken full-time over one year or part-time over two years.

Entry requirements

A minimum of an upper second-class UK Bachelor's degree in an appropriate science, engineering, mathematics or other non-management subject, or an overseas qualification of an equivalent standard.
