Artist Q&A with Cécile B. Evans: *An Adaptation of Giselle* - ongoing. 9th February 2021 4pm.



Cécile B. Evan's work uses film, performance, installation and sculpture and primarily examines the role of emotions and their engagement with technological, ideological and physical structures in contemporary society. Her work is held in many permanent museum collections including Castello di Rivolli in Turin, and the Whitney and MoMA in New York. Her most recent work, *An Adaptation of Giselle* is an ongoing adaptation of the industrial era ballet, part of which premiered at Centre Pompidou in Paris in 2020. We are excited to discuss the dimensions of this project in a Q&A hosted by CSCA next week.
