Portfolio Preparation Advice

A portfolio of design work is required of all master's applicants.

The portfolio should include academic work, practice experience and one personal practice project.

Applicants should prepare the portfolio carefully to best illustrate their individual potential as a designer. The Portfolio needs to be curated to clearly show your ambition and curiosity of your practice.

Academic Group work is accepted but it needs to be clearly indicated. Group work needs to be marked to indicate what your role was in the project. Missing indication may result in rejection.

- 1. ACADEMIC STUDY: Undergraduate/BA architectural project work, showing process and synthesis of design proposal(s). You must show one complete project with a full set of General Arrangement drawings and technical understanding (up to 10 pages work)
- 2. PERSONAL PROJECT: Evidence of one personal architectural/ spatial project that reflects your contemporary practice, and your ambition for future studies on an Architecture MArch course (up to 2 pages)
- 3. PRACTICE EXPERIENCE: Evidence of work experience and any independent project work highlighting your specific contribution. Please show any site experience and technical drawings that were constructed (up to 5 pages)
- 4. TECHNICAL STUDIES: Evidence construction details and technical understanding (up to 2 pages)

Your digital portfolio must not exceed 20 pages, including your coversheet and table of contents.

Applicants should upload their portfolio following the guidance above at the point of application wherever possible. To do so, please follow the instructions below:

Please upload a word document which includes your name and a link to your online portfolio to the 'additional document' option in the supporting material section of the online application system.

If you have not submitted your portfolio at the point of application, we will send you a portfolio submission request. We cannot open the upload function on request from applicants, so please wait for us to contact you.

Please note that your application will not be considered by the tutor until this supporting material has been received.
