Members of the admissions panel are looking for highly motivated applicants with the skills and attributes that will enable them to make the most of, and contribute to, the programme. Please provide a link to your portfolio pdf. This can be a link to a document saved in Dropbox, OneDrive, or Google Docs. Please avoid posting your portfolio on issuu or using WeTransfer. The portfolio is used to assess applicants' aptitude for visual and creative thinking and design and to gauge previous relevant experience, and individual interests. Our reviewers see hundreds of portfolios so consider how to make your portfolio have an impact. Selected works Portfolios should not exceed 20 pages.

Focus

The focus of the portfolio should be your best and most recent work, including examples undertaken during an academic degree and/or carried out while in practice. Include a variety of work, scales and media to demonstrate creative talent including any work in time-based or interactive media (you can add active links to YouTube or Vimeo content in your portfolio pdf). Give evidence of independent work and clearly state your role within any group projects. Make sure to demonstrate your curiosity or experience in fields relating to cinematic and videogame architecture.

Design ability must be demonstrated including:

- Concept development and problem-solving
- A broad range of projects undertaken with a variety of outputs using diverse creative media
- Intelligent, original communication of ideas and narratives
- Evidence of relevant modelling and time-based/interactive design software use
- Strong drawing, graphic, image-making, time-based and interactive skills
- Confident and expressive visual language
