1. What is this project about?

We are exploring the sharing / collaborative economies at play in the unique Hackney Wick and Fish Island (HWFI) creative local community as part of a pilot study on population, space and place.

We are collecting data so that we can learn where, what and how residents and workers in the area participate in the sharing economy and creation of a sustainable community.

3. Who we are & our code of ethics.

We are a team of researchers from University College London (UCL) collaborating with William Chamberlain of Hackney Wick & Fish Island CIC and local community via citizen scientists. The research team follows the UCL Research Ethics Framework. This means we follow a set of industry standards about research quality and ethics. For people taking part in our research projects this means:

- You have the right to request that any specific comments you make are deleted from the research
- You will not be identifiable in any of the materials we produce
- You have the right to withdraw from the research project at any point
- The research will be carried out by appropriately experienced researchers
- All data will be password protected and digitally stored in a secure location.
