Since 2010, the Guangdong provincial government has mobilised its cities to establish an extensive network of greenways to link up major green spaces and settlements in the province. Receiving wide acclaim in China as an initiative of sustainable development, the network has expanded rapidly over the years, reaching a total length of over 10,000 km in early 2015.
