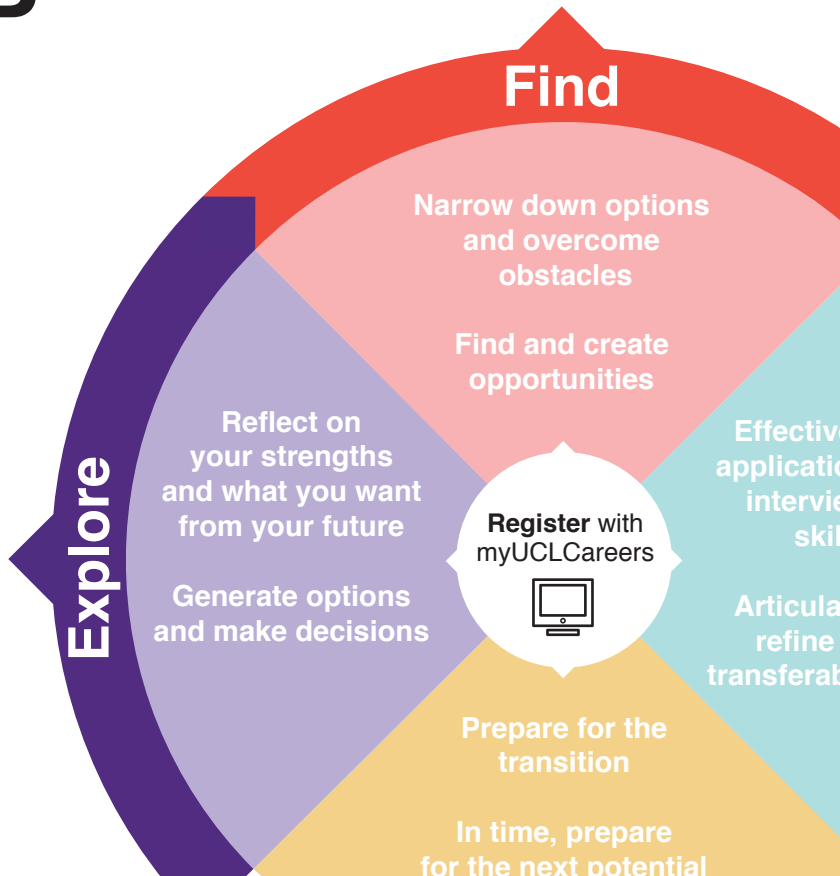

Learn more about **careers paths**, common obstacles and how to overcome them by asking graduates



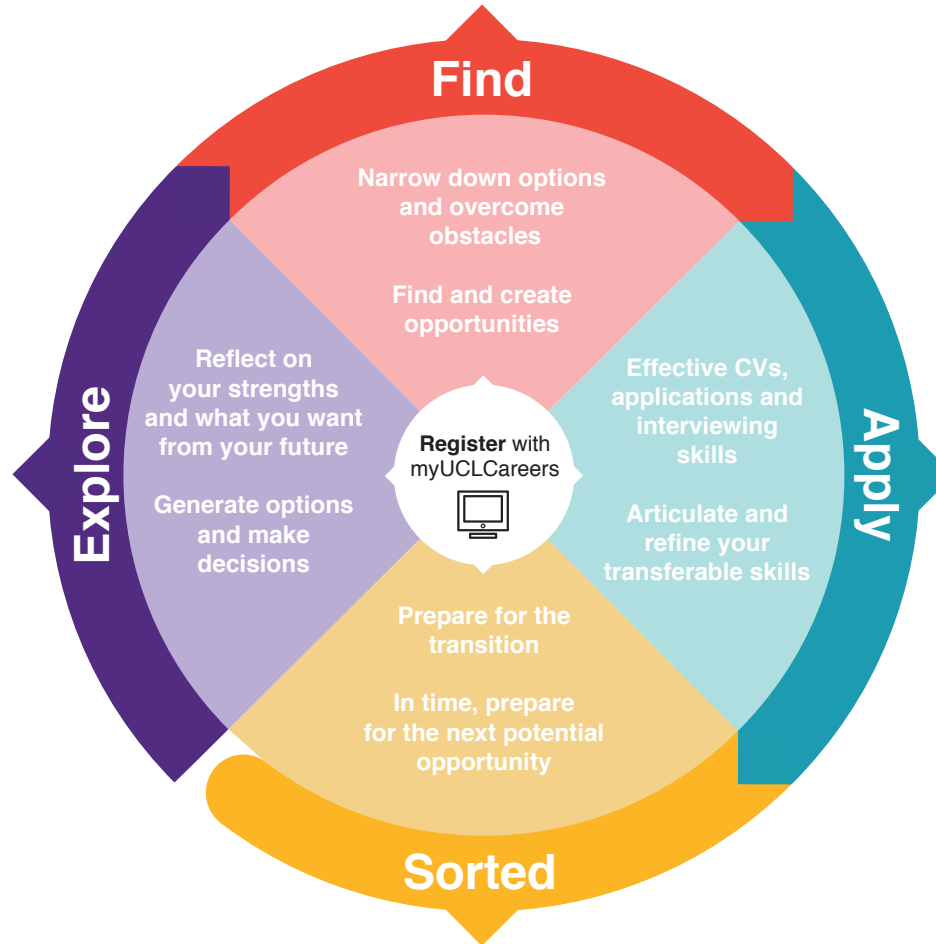
Test it out by finding **work experience** and internships
