

Departmental Prizes and Scholarships

The department may award the following prizes on the basis of undergraduate work. The prizes range in value from a share of £30 to £1000.

Tufnell Scholarship	The Tufnell Scholarship is awarded to the best graduate, under the age of 24, progressing to the Research School. Paid over 2 years.
Bader Prize	The Bader Prize is awarded to the best postgraduate beginning research in Organic (to include Medicinal and Biological) Chemistry.
Nyholm Prize	The Nyholm Prize is awarded to the final year undergraduate who is considered to have done the most distinguished work in Inorganic Chemistry.
Sondheimer Prize	The Sondheimer Prize is awarded to the final year undergraduate who is considered to have done the most distinguished work in Organic Chemistry.
Parke Davis Prize	The Parke Davis Prize is awarded to the final year undergraduate who is considered to have done the most distinguished work in Medicinal Chemistry.
Vernon Prize	The Vernon Prize is awarded to the final year undergraduate who is considered to have done the most distinguished work in Biological Chemistry.
Poole Prize	The Poole Prize is awarded to the final year undergraduate who is considered to have done the most distinguished work in Physical Chemistry.
Sharp Prize	The Sharp Prize is awarded to the final year undergraduate who is considered to have done the most distinguished work in Theoretical Chemistry.
Ingold Prize	The Ingold Prize is awarded to undergraduates who are considered to have achieved a high academic standard during the session.
Faculty Medal and Prize	The Faculty Medal and Prize is awarded to the best final year undergraduate in the faculty of Mathematical and Physical Sciences.
Neil Arnott	The Neil Arnott Prize is awarded to the best chemistry graduate in the University of London. Assessed by interview.
Dean's List	The Dean's List is a list of the best students (usually about 10) in the Faculty. No monetary value.
