BA Route 1: Classics (Language and Literature)

Take Greek and Latin (from year 2 it's possible to specialise in one language): study the literature and culture of these civilisations, and take other ancient languages such as Hittite if you wish.

Year 1

- (a) Compulsory modules (105 credits):
 - CLAS0004 Approaches to studying the Ancient World (15 credits)
 - Ancient Greek, at level corresponding to previous experience (30 credits)
 - Latin, at level corresponding to previous experience (30 credits)
 - CLAS0005 Interpreting Greek Literature (15 credits)
 - CLAS0006 Interpreting Roman Literature (15 credits)
- (b) Optional / elective module (15 credits):
 - Modules in the field of Classics and the Ancient World (History, Greek & Latin, Hebrew & Jewish, Archaeology) (15 credits)
 - o Or an approved module from another department/College (15 credits)

Year 2

- (a) Compulsory modules (60 credits):
 - Ancient Greek and / or Latin (60 credits, usually 30 credits in each language, but specialization in one language or uneven distribution is possible)
- (b) Optional / elective modules (60 credits):
 - Modules in the field of Classics and the Ancient World (History, Greek & Latin, Hebrew & Jewish, Archaeology) (up to 60 credits)
 - Approved modules from another department/College (up to 30 credits)*

*Maximum modules outside the field in years 2-3 is 30 credits.

Year 3

- (a) Compulsory modules (75 credits)
 - Ancient Greek and / or Latin (60 credits, usually 30 credits in each language, but specialization in one language or uneven distribution is possible)
 - Final-year dissertation (30 credits)
- (b) Optional / elective modules (30 credits):
 - Modules in the field of Classics and the Ancient World (up to 30 credits)
 - Approved modules from another department/College (up to 30 credits)*

*Maximum modules outside the field in years 2-3 is 30 credits.

BA Route 2: Literature, History, Archaeology

Take Greek or Latin for at least 4 terms, and study the literature, history, philosophy and archaeology of ancient Europe and the Middle East: you can develop your own specialisation.

Year 1

- (a) Compulsory modules (75 credits):
 - CLAS0004 Approaches to Studying the Ancient World (15 credits)
 - Ancient Greek or Latin, at level corresponding to previous experience (30 credits)
 - One History module HIST, usually HIST011 Sources for Greek History or HIST0009 The Romans and their Past (15 credits)
 - One Archaeology module ARCL, usually ARCL0001 Introduction to Roman Archaeology or ARCL0005 Introduction to Greek Archaeology or ARCL0007 Introduction to Egyptian and Ancient Near Eastern Archaeology (15 credits)
- (b) Optional / elective modules (45 credits):
 - Modules in the field of Classics and the Ancient World (History, Greek & Latin, Hebrew & Jewish, Archaeology) (up to 45 credits)
 - Approved modules from another department/College (up to 30 credits)

Year 2

- (a) Compulsory modules (60 credits):
 - Ancient Greek or Latin, at level corresponding to previous experience (30 credits)
 - Ancient literature or language modules (30 credits)
- (b) Optional / elective modules (60 credits):
 - Modules in the field of Classics and the Ancient World (History, Greek & Latin, Hebrew & Jewish, Archaeology) (up to 60 credits)
 - Approved modules from another department/College (up to 30 credits)*

Year 3

 - Final-year dissertation (30 credits)
 - Ancient literature or language modules (30 credits)
- (b) Optional / elective modules (60 credits):
 - Modules in the field of Classics and the Ancient World (up to 60 credits)
 - Approved modules from another department/College (up to 30 credits)*
 - *Maximum modules outside the field in years 2-3 is 30 credits.

BA Route 3: Middle Eastern Studies

Take ancient cuneiform languages, and study the literature, history, religion, and archaeology of the ancient Middle East and Europe in a flexible and interdisciplinary degree programme.

Year 1

- (a) Compulsory modules (90 credits):
 - CLAS0004 Approaches to Studying the Ancient World (15 credits)
 - Ancient cuneiform language (30 credits)
 - Ancient History modules (30 credits)
 - Archaeology module (15 credits)
- (b) Optional / elective modules (30 credits):
 - Modules in the field of Classics and the Ancient World (History, Greek & Latin, Hebrew & Jewish, Archaeology) (up to 30 credits)
 - Approved modules from another department/College (up to 30 credits)

Year 2

- (a) Compulsory modules (60 credits):
 - Ancient cuneiform language (30 credits)
 - Ancient History Second-Year Research Seminar (30 credits)
- (b) Optional / elective modules (60 credits):
 - Modules in the field of Classics and the Ancient World, including another Ancient Middle Eastern language (up to 60 credits)
 - Approved modules from another department/College (up to 30 credits)*

*Maximum modules outside the field in years 2-3 is 30 credits.

Year 3

- (a) Compulsory modules (60 credits)
 - Ancient cuneiform language (30 credits)
 - Final-year dissertation (30 credits)
- (b) Optional / elective modules (60 credits):
 - Modules in the field of Classics and the Ancient World, including another Ancient Middle Eastern language (up to 60 credits)
 - Approved modules from another department/College (up to 30 credits)*

*Maximum modules outside the field in years 2-3 is 30 credits.
