

Government Defeat in Lords on Procurement Bill [HL]

On 30/11/2022 the government had a defeat in the House of Lords on an amendment to the Procurement Bill [HL]: To add forced organ harvesting to the list of grounds on which a supplier may be subject to discretionary exclusion from bidding for public contracts.

This was defeat number 11 in the parliamentary session.
