

Government Defeat in Lords on Illegal Migration Bill

On 03/07/2023 the government had a defeat in the House of Lords on an amendment to the Illegal Migration Bill: To exempt people who have been unlawfully exploited in the United Kingdom from removal during the statutory recovery period for potential victims of slavery or human trafficking.

This was defeat number 72 in the parliamentary session.
