

Government Defeat in Lords on West Midlands Combined Authority (Transfer of Police and Crime Commissioner Functions) Order 2024

Wednesday 13/03/2024

On 13/03/2024 the government had a defeat in the House of Lords on an amendment to the West Midlands Combined Authority (Transfer of Police and Crime Commissioner Functions) Order 2024: To regret that the draft Order entails the transfer of power being completed without the consent of other relevant local authorities; and that the public consultation required by law was not commenced before an initial decision was made (non-fatal motion).

This was defeat number 22 in the parliamentary session.
