Demonstration Performance

Both conferences will be preceded by three days of workshops, supported by the W.I.D.E programme (UNIPR) and organised by Francesca Bortoletti (Parma) and Giovanna Di Martino (UCL). These will be directed by playwright and director Marco Martinelli (Teatro delle Albe) and academic and dramaturg Giovanna Di Martino. Participants will be university students from the University of Parma, UCL, and Oxford, and school students from local secondary schools in Parma (Romagnosi, Toschi, and Scuola per l'Europa), and in London. The group will work on the performance of a number of scenes from a selection of early modern performance scripts based on Aristophanes' *Wealth*, and will investigate the performability and intricate web of citations embedded within early modern dramatic scripts.
