## All participants must have the MMSE administered. This should be processed by the Research Coder.

1. The following equipment is required to administer the MMSE:

- a watch with a second hand on it
- a pencil
- 3 blank sheets of paper (A4)
- a laminated card with "CLOSE YOUR EYES" written in large letters
- a laminated card with two 5-sided figures intersecting to make a 4-sided diamond figure.
- MMSE questionnaire on which a label with name and study number are placed.
- a clipboard

2. Introduce yourself and try to gain the participant's confidence.
3. Before the questionnaire is administered, be sure that the participant is sitting down facing you and that $\mathrm{s} / \mathrm{he}$ is comfortable.
Assess the participant's ability to hear and understand very simple conversation, eg:- What is your name, please?
If the participant uses hearing or visual aids, make sure the participant has and uses these before starting.
4. It is important that you speak slowly and clearly. If the participant appears not to have heard or understood, repeat the question (unless the item specifically prohibits repetition).
Ask each question a maximum of three times. If the participant does not respond - score 0. DO NOT CORRECT IF A WRONG ANSWER IS GIVEN, and MAKE SURE NOT TO SHOW ANY FACIAL EXPRESSIONS.
5. If the participant answers "What did you say?" - do not explain or engage in conversation merely repeat the same directions (eg:- What year is this?) to a maximum of 3 times.

If the participant answers incorrectly - score 0 and do not hint, prompt or ask the question again, eg:- What year is this? - 1952.
Accept that answer - do not ask the question again, hint or provide any physical clues such as head shaking, etc.
6. If the participant interrupts eg:- "What's this for?" Just reply:
"I will explain in a few minutes when we are finished. Now if we could just proceed please, we are almost finished or this will take only a few minutes" if you have just started.
7. Make note of any unusual responses including any extra memory items recalled.

## Question 3 - Spelling "World"

Please remember that you can help the participant spell the word "world". You may describe it "as in the globe" if they do not understand from your accent.

## Coding the MMSE

After the interview you will be required to code the results from the MMSE. It is important that you do not code the questionnaire until the participant has left the room.

## 5. EXPRESSION: NAMING

Accurate naming is needed; descriptions of function or approximate answers are not acceptable. Some items may have more than one correct name, as has been indicated. Errors include description of function (eg:- 'used for telling the time' for watch).
In the case of approximate answers, you should say 'Can you think of another word for it?'
Tick each item correctly named and enter number correct under total.


Only one presentation is allowed so it is essential that you read the phrase clearly and slowly, enunciating all the S's
"I am going to say something and I would like you to repeat it after me: 'No ifs, ands or buts'

## 7. LANGUAGE: READING COMPREHENSION

## 8. PRAXIS: IDEATIONAL

Do not repeat instructions or coach. Score a move as correct only if it takes place in the correct sequence. Tick each correct move and enter number correct under total. Maximum score $=3$ points. (Note 0 if not done or not done correctly; 1 if correct).


## 9. PRAXIS: COPYING AND DRAWING

The participant should draw and write on the sheet of paper provided. Each pentagon should have 5 sides and 5 clear corners and the overlap should form a diamond.
