About Positive Voices

Positive Voices is a large-scale survey of adults living with HIV and attending one of 73 NHS HIV specialist clinics in England and Wales. Results will provide valuable insights about living with HIV that will be used to inform improvements to services.

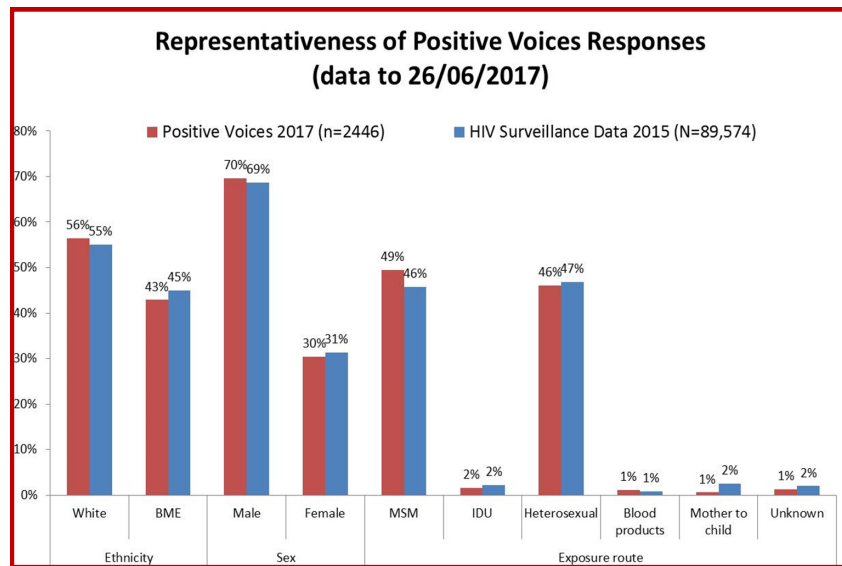
The questionnaire can be completed on a paper or on-line. It aims to recruit between 3,000 and 4,000 patients from January – September 2017. All participants receive a £5 gift voucher as a thank you.

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NEWSFLASH!! So far, the responses received are representative of the data from the HIV and AIDS Reporting System. This is a big improvement from the pilot study and great news, as it means the results will reflect the experiences of everyone living with HIV.
