## \*\*\* UCL Research Excellence Scholarships (UCL-RES) \*\*\*

UCL's main research scholarship schemes are now open for 2024/25 entry.

We are pleased to consider applications from prospective students for the **Research Excellence Scholarship (UCL-RES)** which offers 40 fully funded scholarships.

We are also happy to consider applications for one of the 5 open <u>China Scholarship Council-UCL Joint Research Scholarships (UCL-CSC)</u>.

Scholarship applications will be reviewed by IGH and **TWO** candidates from the RES scholarship scheme (plus one CSC candidate if applicable) will be recommended for consideration and decision centrally.

The UCL scheme is highly competitive, based on research excellence, and only a small number of applicants are successful in securing these scholarships across the whole of UCL (40 scholarship places).

## \*\*\* UCL Research Opportunity Scholarship (UCL-ROS) \*\*\*

UCL's <u>Research Opportunity Scholarship (UCL-ROS)</u> supports BAME postgraduate research degree students who are eligible for UK / home fee status and UK-permanent resident from certain BAME ethnic groups. There are 5 scholarships for applicants to any UCL faculty.

UCL-ROS applications will be reviewed by IGH and **one eligible** candidate from the ROS scholarship scheme recommended to a central panel to complete a UCL Research Scholarship (ROS) Application.

## How to apply

Applications for UCL-RES and-UCL ROS must be submitted by Friday 12th January 2024.

**Please note, prospective scholarship students must** also submit a **complete graduate application** for admission onto a UCL research degree programme by the scholarship deadline. You do not need to have secured an offer of a place at UCL to apply for the scholarship, but you must have submitted your **complete** UCL research degree application to UCL Admissions by this deadline.

For information about how to apply to the Global Health MPhil/PhD programme, please see our <u>prospectus</u> and <u>programme</u> webpages, including the requirement to submit a 3-4 page project <u>proposal</u> and <u>secure a primary supervisor before</u> applying.

Institute for Global Health applicants should notify us by <u>email</u> that they would like to apply and submit all scholarship application documents to that email address. Full details are available via the above UCL-RES and UCL-ROS scholarship webpages.

We will contact IGH applicants at the end of January to inform them whether they are among the nominated candidates.

Project proposals for applicants who are not awarded a UCL Research Scholarships, but who are still interested in joining our MPhil/PhD programme, will be internally reviewed by two academics and an offer of a place will, in part, be subject to positive reviews. Applicants will need to secure funding from other sources.
