The 2020 Annual Hazlitt Lecture and the 19th Hazlitt Day School, organized by Gregory Dart, Uttara Natarajan, Philipp Hunnekuhl and James Whitehead will take place at University College London on Saturday 19th September 2020.

The Annual Lecture, entitled '**Hazlitt, De Quincey, and Murder**' will be given by **Frances Wilson** from 4pm in the Gustave Tuck Theatre, UCL. Attendance is free of charge. The Day School precedes the Annual Lecture from 9.30am and provides an opportunity for readers and scholars of Hazlitt to explore a whole range of topics relating to Hazlitt and his circle, as well as to meet each other and exchange ideas.

A small fee applies for the admission to the Day School (£20/£15), which includes morning coffee, lunch and afternoon tea. The organizers hope to welcome back a large number of regular attendees, as well as new participants.

The pace of the event is comparatively relaxed, yet a good deal is included in the morning and early afternoon: Freya Johnston will give the opening plenary, and shorter papers will be delivered by Anna Mercer, Hannah Tran, Robert-Louis Abrahamson and James Grande. After the Annual Lecture, the day will conclude at the Marlborough Arms, Torrington Place, in close proximity to University College, from 5.30pm.

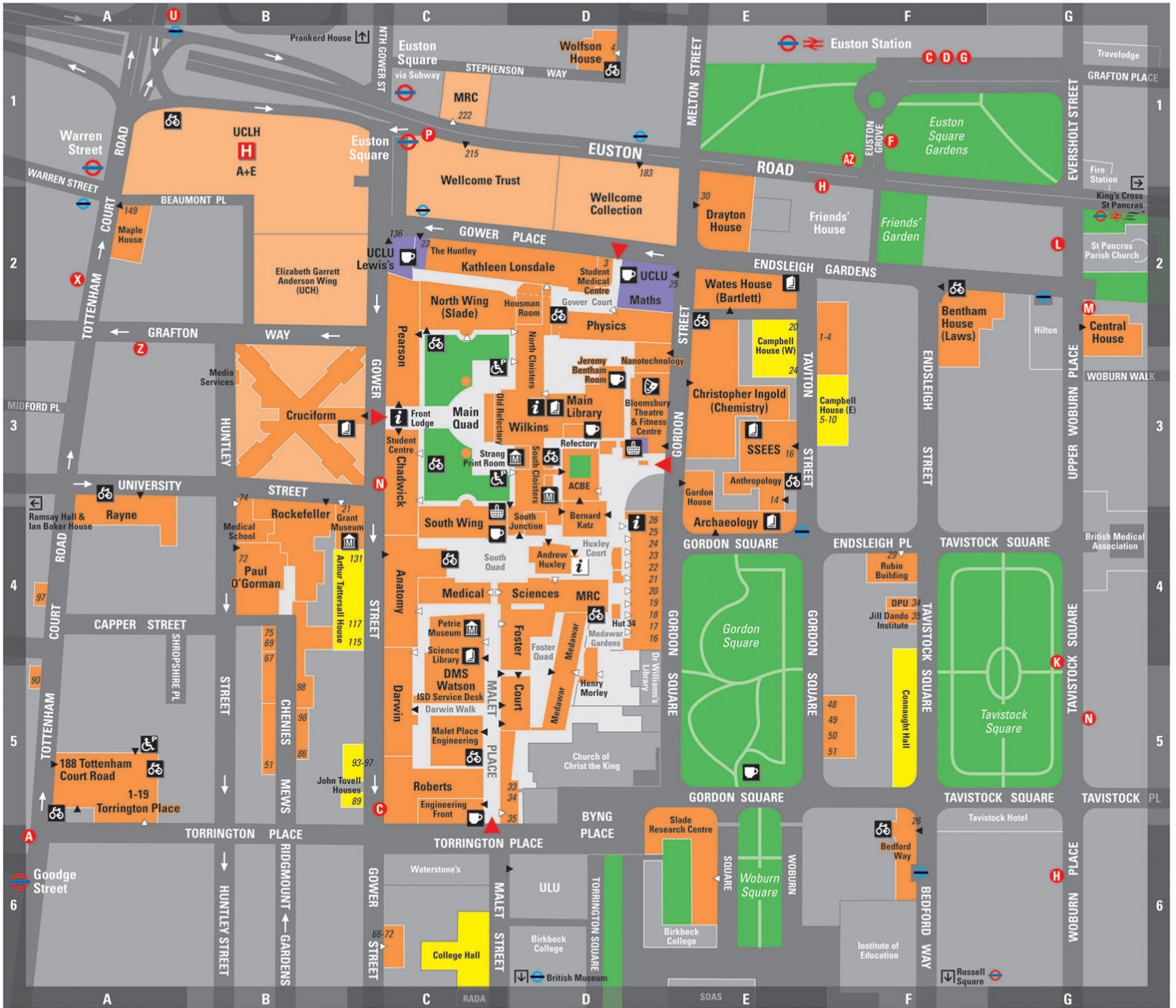
Admission
