
## Upgrade

The <u>upgrade</u> occurs at the end of Y1 for full-time students or in Y2 for part-time students.

At the 6 months mark (12 months for PT) you will need to submit a report to your supervisor. Following that, you will need to pepare a chapter overview, a plan for completion, a 5,000 words writing sample and a bibliography, which will be assessed by a small panel (Grad Tutor, Second Supervisor and an external)

While not part of the assessment, you will be encouraged to give a presentation on your current research to your peers as part of your skills development

# CRS




## **Completing Research Status**

If you are eligible you may register as a completing research status (CRS) student while you write up your thesis. You will only be permitted to move to CRS status with the approval of your supervisor or other departmental authority.

The CRS period is 12 months for FT and 24 months for PT students.

Thesis submission is expected in the normal period of registration. If you are moved to CRS this means your thesis is pending and that you should submit your thesis ASAP. The end date of your CRS period is the last possible submission date – not your due date.

# Submit



## Submit

You should start preparing for your <u>submission</u> four (4) months in advance of your intended submission date. This is done by filling in an online form in Portico.

- you will then receive a comfirmation your supervisor will identify and get approval for
- examiners you submit your thesis
- your supervisor, the examiners and you agree on a
- viva date, at least 6 workweeks after the date of your submission you defend your thesis
