What to do if you are exposed to human blood or bodily fluids



1 Encourage bleeding if there is a puncture wound - but do not suck the wound!



2 Wash wound or exposed area with soap

and water or irrigate eyes with water



3 Report to line manager/DSO.



4 Report for assessment within 1 hour

Hampstead Campus – Call 'needle stick hotline' on 020 7794 3301 During office hours (8.30 - 16.00 weekdays) You will be put through to an occupational health advisor

who will arrange your post exposure care and treatment if appropriate. Out of office hours: Listen to the whole message on the answering machine and attend Royal Free Hospital A&E for management of the incident. Ensure that you contact UCL Occupational Health the next working day for follow up of the incident. If HIV transmission is a risk, attend A&E immediately and discuss this with the A&E doctor.

Archway Campus – Whittington Accident and Emergency Department Post Graduate Institutes at sites other than above – follow local NHS Trust **Procedure**
