

- or bodily fluids
 - 1 Encourage bleeding if there is a puncture wound but do not suck the wound!
 - 2 Wash wound or exposed area with soap and water or irrigate eyes with water
 - 3 Report to line manager/DSO.
 - 4 Report for assessment within 1 hour

During office hours (8.30 - 16.00 weekdays) You will be put through to an occupational health advisor who will arrange your post exposure care and treatment if appropriate.

Out of office hours: Listen to the whole message on the answering machine and attend Royal Free Hospital A&E for management of the incident. Ensure that you contact UCL Workplace Health the next working day for follow up of the incident. If HIV transmission is a risk, attend A&E immediately and discuss this with the A&E doctor.
