Our PhD Students

It has never been more necessary or important to support earlier career researchers. One way that we do this at IBIL is to ring-fence a proportion of our sponsorship income for the IBIL Research Scholarship fund. The IBIL Research Scholarship is open to all UCL PhD applicants who are accepted by the Faculty of Laws and who are undertaking research in the field of intellectual property law. It is awarded on the basis of academic merit, and covers all university fees and provides an annual stipend for a period of three years.



Joshua Bradley was awarded the IBIL IP Research Scholarship in 2020. Josh is an engineering graduate, a licensed US attorney and former USPTO patent examiner, working in the unit for business method and software patents. He also holds a JD/MBA from the

United States and an LLM in IP law from Italy.

Josh is researching subject matter eligibility in patent law. He hopes that his research will advance reform of the current ambiguous standard of determining eligibility in the modern era with a more harmonized, certain, and predictable version of this complex area. He believes this research is important because the information age has ushered in new importance on data and 'information' inventions – such as Internet, software, and business method technologies – meaning that patent law may need to adapt, both in the US and globally, to incorporate these non-traditional inventions.



Alina Shchetinina was awarded the IBIL IP Research Scholarship in 2021. She holds an LLM from the University of Vienna (Distinction) where she obtained a grant from the Higher Education Scholarship Foundation for Law Students. Alina obtained both her

Bachelor (Distinction) and first Master (Distinction) Degrees at the Yaroslav the Wise National Law University of Ukraine. Prior to joining UCL, she worked as the Senior Legal Counsel at a German-based tech company.

Alina's research explores the impact of the dilution doctrine on the right to free speech.
