
MySSy is a research prototype of a new kind of Living Archives; a place for you to manage your info - especially records of your time in Care and beyond.

It has been built as an independent recordkeeping registry together with a mock integrated network environment




# MySSy – Sharing personal information and other records

### **Controlled Sharing**

Records are stored and served by the registry server with the sharing controlled by

- setting an audience tag and expiry time,
- optionally requiring a security code for access; and
- optionally including a customizable consent notice or terms of sharing.



When a controlled share is created, the URL is shown as a string and as a QR code.

The record is displayed as an encoded image – the only way to obtain a copy is to screenshot the browser displaying the record, or (with some programming skills) reverse engineer the encoded image.

You can track the access history of any share and extend or cancel as you need to.


# **MySSy** – Registering Records

### **Register Record Holding Sites**


Locate and track the organisations that hold records about you.

Record holding sites may be found by browsing and/or searching.

In searching you can choose to ignore sites that may have unpleasant memories and associations that you don't want to deal with.




# **MySSy** – Registering Records



Once registered you can add your own metadata and notes, and specify which profiles to share them with.


