Please see the conference website for further details of this year's theme 'Fevers, Frets, and Futures'. Students are invited to enter their independently researched sole-authored/created or collaborative work, in any of the following categories:

- Best Postgraduate (including PhD) research poster/abstract prize
- Best Undergraduate research poster/abstract prize
- 2D and 3D Visual arts prize: eg photograpy, painting, drawing, sculpture etc.
- Performance/Movement/Audio prize: eg film, performance, dance, music, etc.
- Creative writing prize : eg short story, poetry or other form of writing practice

To enter please email your abstract or submission to **student@amh.ac.uk** by 9 am on Tuesday 11th April (BST)

Submissions should include:

- Posters: A 250-word abstract, 4 keywords, and a 50-word biography (posters will be judged on site the day, Wed 5th July, from all accepted posters, when the winner will be announced). You will need to send a PDF of your finished poster one week before the conference, ie by 27.06.22.
- **2D and 3D Visual arts**: Up to 5 images with a title, medium, date, brief description of up to 250 words for a series or up to 50 words per individual image, 4 keywords, and a 50-word biography.
- **Performance and movement**: title, medium, brief description of up to 250-words, 4 keywords, link to the site of performance or video (no longer than 10 mins) and a 50-word biography.
- Creative writing: Title, abstract and sample writing (no more than 1,000 words) and a 50-word biography.

Please indicate which strand you are applying to in the subject line. Submissions must conform to the conference theme of *Fevers, Frets, and Futures: uncertainty and new ecologies for post-Covid healthcare*.

Winners will be expected to write a blog about their work for publication on www.amh.ac.uk.
