This workshop was jointly coordinated by Prof Shahina Pardhan, the Director of Vision and Eye Research Unit (VERU), Postgraduate Medical Institute of Anglia Ruskin University and Professor Fei Chen from the Department of Electrical and Electronic Engineering of Southern University of Science and Technology. It aimed to bring together early career researchers and experts in the areas of vision and hearing research, with backgrounds ranging from clinical ophthalmology, orthoptics, optometry, audiology, and psychology, to fundamental sciences including auditory and visual psychophysics, and

engineering. As such, the packed programme of talks covered a wide array of medical conditions impacting both hearing and vision, including diabetes, Meniere's disease and dementia.

The Women in Vision UK Network was set up with the vision of promoting connections between women working in the vision and eye research fields, fostering collaborative efforts and mentoring opportunities, and increasing the profile of women in this area. The meeting had an inspiring list of speakers, including Michele Acton, CEO of Fight for Sight; Professor Shahina Pardhan, first female UK Professor of Optometry and head of Anglia Ruskin University's Vision and Eye Research Unit; and Professor Sarah Coupland, Association for Research in Vision and Ophthalmology (ARVO) Vice President and head of the North West Cancer Research
