ANTITRUST AND INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

The relationship between intellectual property rights, antitrust and regulation continues to give rise to controversial policy issues and presents a number of challenges for antitrust enforcers, business, and advisers. A number of important judgments, antitrust decisions and regulatory initiatives have been taken in this area and more are forthcoming fuelling the policy and academic debate. The Jevons Institute 2007 Colloquium will focus specifically on two areas that are at forefront of this debate:

- * the use of IP rights in standard setting organisations and the scope of Fair, Reasonable and Non-Discriminatory licensing obligations
- * the use and abuse of IP rights in the pharmaceutical sector striking a regulatory balance between rewarding innovation and preventing harmful practices (including issues such as excessive pricing, parallel imports, and patent misuse)

In the spirit of the aims of the Jevons Institute these themes will be analysed from both an economic and legal perspective.
