

This annual lecture honors William B. Lockhart, dean of the University of Minnesota Law School from 1956-72. Instrumental in enriching the Law School curriculum and attracting highly qualified faculty and students, he also cultivated a strong relationship with the Minnesota Bar, which continues to provide essential support to the Law School. During his 28 years as a professor at the Law School (1946-74), he shared his gifts of teaching excellence and scholarly leadership with students and faculty. After retiring at Minnesota, Dean Lockhart taught on the faculty of the University of California, Hastings College of Law (1974-94). He died in December 1995.

DAME HAZEL GENN is Dean of Laws, Professor of Socio-Legal Studies, and co-director of the University College London Judicial Institute. Previously she headed the Department of Law at Queen Mary and Westfield College, University of London, and conducted research at the Oxford University Centre for Socio-Legal Studies and Cambridge Institute of Criminology. She was appointed an inaugural commissioner on the independent Judicial Appointments Commission for England and Wales in 2006 and a member of the Secretary of the State's Advisory Panel on Judicial Diversity in 2009. A 12-year member of the Judicial Studies Board, she contributed to the design and delivery of training for the judiciary in England and Wales at all levels. She has been a Fellow of the British Academy since 2000. In this lecture, she draws on her experience to speak about judicial selection issues of significance to others striving to improve the quality of the judiciary: how and why England changed its method of selecting judges, how the current system enhances superior selections, and the challenges that remain.
