

HARD DISK QUOTAS

To remove any confusion with regard to hard disk quotas:

Only files like `.cshrc` and source codes/executables (that I know about, which could be assigned to `e05-mcc`) should be assigned to `e05`.

When a new file is created HPCx selects the quota associated with the folder/directory where the file is created.

It is therefore good practise to work within

```
/hpcx/{home or work}/e05/e05-*/+++
```

rather than

```
/hpcx/{home or work}/e05/e05/+++
```

that way (fingers crossed) the correct quotas will be used.

Usage for a particular quota will not change if a file is moved (from `e05` to `e05-cat`, for example).

To check which quota a file is assigned just execute the command

```
ls -ltr *
```

The third and fourth columns label the user and group ownership. As we allocate hard disk quotas to groups the group ownership should NOT read `e05` (apart from files like `.cshrc` and source codes, which I know about) but `e05-*`.

To change group ownerships use the command

```
chgrp -R e05-*** *
```

NB `***` is the first few letters of your group leaders surname and `+++` is your username.
