5 UCL Graduate Admissions Team

The UCL Graduate Admissions Team will review your application and check that it is complete.

Your completed application will be sent to our admissions team in the Faculty of Laws to be assessed.

The UCL Graduate Admissions Team will process your offer or unsuccessful application in the portal.



LAWS Graduate Admissions Team

– based in the Faculty



We will assess your application to verify if you meet the programme entry requirements.

We will either recommend your offer has been successful or unsuccessful to the UCL Graduate Admissions Team.
