ASSESSMENT TASK AND FINISH GROUP

The Assessment and Feedback Unit (AFU) task and finish group is a group dedicated to collaboration between staff and students to improve and synthesise any assessment related student feedback with an overall goal of improving medical school assessments at UCLMS.

Over the past year, we have worked on improving feedback processes, such as ensuring the ASR ILOs relevant to each exam guestion are released alongside the marks and increasing transparency surrounding assessment at UCLMS by revamping the AFU Moodle page. Most recently the group has worked on releasing a document to clarify the purpose of formative assessments to students and student members of the group have peer-led a session for new Y1 students on how to receive formative feedback as an adult learner. T&F group meetings are held at least 1-2 times monthly during term time and is made up of AFU staff, Year 1, 2 and 3 student reps with a particular interest in all things assessment, and myself as the Academic VP (Y1-3).

We welcome Dr Nimesh Patel as our new Assessment lead and hope to continue our close work with staff in this aspect of education.
