

UCL Applied Renal Physiology Course 2019

Venue: Sir William Wells Atrium, Ground Floor, Royal Free Hospital, Pond Street, London, NW3 2PF

The Sir William Wells Atrium is a modern conference hall situated on the Ground Floor of Royal Free Hospital which is located in Hampstead, in northwest London.

Directions to Royal Free Hospital

Underground: The Northern Line is on the London Underground (Belsize Park Station).

Rail: The London Overground (Hampstead Heath Station)

Road: Delegates are advised not to drive their own cars to the Royal Free as car parking is limited. Parking is by residential permit or pay and display only.

Bus: Numbers 24, 46, 168, 268 and C11

Directions to the Royal Free Hospital Main Entrance from Belsize Park Underground station



- Turn right out of Belsize Park station and walk up Haverstock Hill to Pond Street
- Turn right at traffic lights on to Pond Street and walk down the Hill to the main entrance of the hospital


Directions to the Royal Free Hospital Main Entrance from Hampstead Heath Overground Station.

- Turn left out of the station and walk along South End Road for a short distance and then turn right into Pond Street
- Walk up Pond Street until you come to a set of concrete steps which take you up to the main hospital entrance level.

The Sir William Wells Atrium (known as The Atrium) is on the Ground Floor of the hospital.

From the main entrance on Pond Street, take the corridor to the left of the main reception area (labelled 2nd Main Entrance on the map on the right below) and the Sir William Wells Atrium is just on your right opposite the history of the Royal Free picture gallery and just before the M&S café.





Parking at the Royal Free Hospital

Please be aware parking is very limited at the hospital and we advise delegates not to drive to the venue.

The multi-storey car park at the Royal Free Hospital is now closed. Parking for patients and visitors is now located in the upper south car park located at the bottom of Rowland Hill Street, off Haverstock Hill.

Parking at the Royal Free Hospital is charged at £3 per hour (max £24, ticket expires at midnight), 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. You can choose to pay at any time during your visit to the hospital, up to midnight of the same day. Visitors can pay for their parking by cash, card, and phone or by downloading the app. The payment line number is 033 0400 7275 and the site code is 79499. For your convenience payment points at the Royal Free Hospital are located at the main entrance (Pond Street), Rowland Hill Street entrance, upper south car park and the out of hours entrance (next to the security office, Pond Street)

There is also a set-down parking zone (immediately outside the main entrance). It is free, but there is a strict no waiting policy in force and you must leave the area within five minutes of arrival.

Blue badge holders

Seven bays are located at the Pond Street entrance and a further five bays located by the A&E entrance. These spaces are free for users with a limited stay of four hours and users must clearly display a time clock in the windscreen of the vehicle. Visitors can register their details on arrival at either the Pond Street reception or security reception (adjacent to A&E) to ensure that you receive free access. Blue badge holders must take their government issued disabled permit with them to register and will not be required to return to their car to display this. Please note that regular parking charges are applicable by blue badge holders when parking in non-designated bays.
