### Module registration process

Places are offered on a first come, first served basis, so to avoid disappointment try to register your module choices as soon as possible.

Check the <a href="#">UCL Online Timetable</a> to ensure your chosen modules don't clash (ensure the year is set to 2021-22)</li><li>2. Log your choices on <a href="#">Portico</a> once Registry has informed you that online module registration has opened.</li></ol>
Third year modules (i.e. all other modules)	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Check the <a href="#">UCL Online Timetable</a> to ensure your chosen modules don't clash (ensure the year is set to 2021-22)</li><li>2. Complete the <a href="#">Psychology Online Module Request Form</a>: You will be emailed if there is a problem with your choices. <b>PLEASE NOTE</b> Whilst completion of this form is mandatory, it does not guarantee acceptance on the module. This can only be confirmed closer to the start of teaching.</li><li>3. Log your choices on <a href="#">Portico</a> once Registry has informed you that online module registration has opened.</li></ol>

## Your responsibilities

You are responsible for checking that:

- Your programme permits you to take your chosen module
- You have the relevant background (if taking a 3<sup>rd</sup> year module), e.g. A level Psychology or PSYC0038/39
- There are no clashes with other modules you will take (you are expected to attend all synchronous classes shown on the online timetable)

**PLEASE NOTE:** Because our modules (except for 0038 and 0039) are part of the Psychology BSc degree, they do not specifically cater for people from outside and cannot make accommodations to any specific needs that may differ from Psychology undergraduates' needs. Assessments will be marked using the same criteria as those used for Psychology students.

The majority of students enrolled on PSYC modules will have a strong background in that field (previous modules they have taken in their programme will prepare them for the advanced modules), and as such you should consider carefully how much you already know about the subject, and whether you will be able to keep up with the pace of the module.

Please ensure that you check the UCL Module Catalogue to find out more about the module before selecting it. You should also realise that Psychology assessments mostly require the writing of essays for which psychology students receive extensive training as part of their programme.

You are generally expected to have a background in Psychology in order to take PSYC modules, so please ensure that you provide clear information in the **Psychology Online Module Request Form (only required for Third Year modules)**.

## Online request form

**Completing the online request form is essential for third year modules;** this is because PSYC modules are very often oversubscribed and this request form enables us to monitor student numbers. **If you fail to complete it your selections on Portico will be automatically rejected.**

However, **completion of the registration process does not guarantee a place on your chosen module/s.** This is because many students are required to study these as an integral part of their programme, and these students must be given priority above elective students.

### **Final registration deadline for PSYC modules on Portico: Fri 8<sup>th</sup> October**

**PLEASE NOTE:** You may not officially get a place until after registration has closed. This is because for many modules we do not know the number of spaces remaining for elective students until that time.

## Rejection

If you are rejected it will be because: you have not fully completed the registration process above or the module is full.
