Unavailable Modules and appropriate background

Only those modules listed above are offered to Affiliate students who are not based in the Psychology department. Note the term in which the modules run.

PLEASE NOTE: Because our modules (except for 0038 and 0039) are part of the Psychology BSc degree, they do not specifically cater for people from other disciplines and cannot make accommodations to any specific needs that may differ from Psychology undergraduates' needs. Assessments will be marked using the same criteria as those used for Psychology BSc students.

The majority of students enrolled on PSYC modules will have a strong background in that field (previous modules they have taken in their programme will prepare them for the advanced modules), and as such you should consider carefully how much you already know about the subject, and whether you will be able to keep up with the pace of the module.

Please ensure that you check the UCL Module Catalogue to find out more about the module before selecting it. You should also realise that Psychology assessments mostly require the writing of essays for which our psychology students receive extensive training as part of their programme. If you are attending 2 or more Psychology modules in a term, then you will be allowed to attend affiliate seminars (but they are not compulsory).

* * Students should note that the **Genes and Behaviour module (PSYC0036)** mainly concentrates on findings from twin and adoption studies (and extended family designs), with only a very basic overview of molecular genetic studies. It requires a good knowledge of statistics and psychometrics (which UCL Psychology undergraduates cover in years 1+2), as well as an understanding of psychiatric phenotypes and an ability to write Psychology essays.

You are generally expected to have a background in Psychology in order to take PSYC modules, so please ensure that you provide clear information in the **Psychology Online Module Request Form (required for Third Year modules only)**.

Your responsibilities

You are responsible for checking that:

- Your programme permits you to take your chosen module
- You have the relevant background (if taking a 2nd or 3rd year module), e.g. previous Psychology modules at College
- There are no clashes with other modules you will take (you are expected to attend all classes that are listed on the online timetable)

Module Registration

Places are offered on a first come, first served basis, so to avoid disappointment try to finalise your module choices as soon as possible (ideally before the end of Induction Week). You should register your module choices as follows:

Completing the online request form is essential for 3rd year modules; this is because PSYC modules are very often oversubscribed and this form enables us to monitor student numbers. **If you fail to complete it your selections on Portico will be automatically rejected**.

Completion of the registration process does not guarantee a place on your chosen module/s. This is because many students are required to study these as an integral part of their programme, and these students must be given priority above elective students.

Final registration deadline for PSYC modules on Portico: Fri 6th October

PLEASE NOTE: If you register in early October, you may not officially get a place until after registration has closed. This is because for many modules we do not know the number of spaces remaining for elective students until that time.

Rejection

If you are rejected it will be because:

- a) you have not fully completed the registration process; or
- b) the module is full
