Advice from Investigators on Supporting their Teams

Some of our local investigators have given some advice on how they are supporting their teams in carrying out the study. Here is what some of you have recommended:

- Keeping the team up to date with information from the research team, as well as with other developments helps to maintain an interest within the whole team
- Meeting up with the staff members who receive PBS training to monitor and review their progress and to offer additional support and guidance if required
- Having a list of clients who have completed study baseline assessments and can be seen by staff trained in PBS when staff are ready
- Ensuring line managers are aware of the list so they can factor it in when they consider the caseload of PBS trained staff
