

ENVIRONMENT DOMAIN CO-CHAIR

(NON-REMUNERATED ACADEMIC POSITION)

Applications are now invited for a UCL Domain Co-Chair in the Environment.

The UCL Domains were established as a means of encouraging synergies and integration across disciplinary and organisational boundaries. The Environment Domain unites those with an interest in all aspects of environment related research and will align with the evolving UCL Strategic Plan 2022-2027, providing academic leadership and bringing together research excellence with world-class teaching. The Environment Domain aims to showcase individual and cross-disciplinary excellence, provide guidance on specific funders and strategic calls and increase the global impact of UCL's environment research. The Environment Domain spans all Schools and Faculties, including disciplines ranging from Earth Sciences to Built Environment, Climate Change, Health, Engineering and Laws, and helps to position UCL at the forefront of global environment research.

The domains are NOT line management structures; rather, they represent the 'horizontal' connections between colleagues who work in different 'vertical' organisational structures (Faculties and departments). The successful candidate will champion an approach to the domain that actively seeks intra-institutional and inter-institutional activities, bringing together scientists from across UCL and beyond.

This will be a non-remunerated position and is available to academic staff based in UCL. The position will be offered in line with the evolving landscape of the Strategic Plan 2022-2027, for a period of three years in the first instance, subject to interim review.

The role holder will require the ability to engage with academic staff at all levels and to create and promote a collegiate and collaborative approach to domain activities. They will have leadership and strong communication skills and work alongside the existing Environment Domain Co-Chair Professor Nick Tyler, the Environment Domain Early Career Researcher Network (EDEN) Co-Chairs, the Environment Domain Strategic Co-ordinator and colleagues across UCL.
