



Alumni Events Code of Conduct

1. Acceptance of Terms

By registering for an event sponsored, hosted, or promoted by UCL and/or UCL alumni, you agree to abide by these terms and conditions. This includes events at third party, non-UCL locations.

You acknowledge that these terms might be changed without prior notice and you accept responsibility with familiarising yourself with, and abiding by, these terms.

Alumni are defined for this purpose as 'individuals who are graduates of the institution and others with a prior academic relationship, including non-graduates, certificate and credential holders, distance learners, residents, post-docs, honorary degree recipients and honorary alumni'.

Current UCL students and non-UCL guests attending alumni events are also covered by this code of conduct.

2. Attendee Conduct

UCL does not tolerate any form of harassment, victimisation or discrimination. We expect that members of the UCL alumni community will treat each other with courtesy and consideration. Event attendees are expected to conduct themselves in a professional and respectful manner to match the theme and tone of the event.

If the event host, be it UCL staff or a former student deems event attendees' behaviour as inappropriate, the event host reserves the right to ban the individual(s) concerned from the use of or access to the land, building, facilities or services.

Prohibited behaviours include, but are not limited to, cases where there is a significant and imminent risk of damage to property, distress or inconvenience to other event attendees, verbal abuse, threats, intimidation, coercion, physical assault, or lewd behaviour.

If you are asked to leave an event as a result of your behaviour, you will not be issued a refund and may be prohibited from attending future events.

4. Filming and Photography

UCL and/or UCL alumni may hire professional or student photographers and/or videographers. By registering for and attending an event, you acknowledge that you may be photographed or filmed during the event. You acknowledge that UCL and/or UCL alumni may use images and/or videos of you for official business use including but not limited to future event promotion, social media posts, and for use on University websites.
