ADDITIONAL UCL STUDENT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. **INTRODUCTION**

- 1.1 University College London (UCL) and the Science Museum (the Science Museum) by an agreement dated 7 October 2021 (the Agreement), have agreed to collaborate on the delivery of a module on the UCL degree programmes of MSc History and Philosophy of Science and MSc Science, Technology and Society (each a Programme) leading to an award from UCL.
- 1.2 You have applied to UCL to study for the Programme and UCL has offered you a place to study on the Programme subject to the standard UCL student terms and conditions and these additional UCL student terms and conditions that apply to the module delivered by the Science Museum.
- 1.2 The Student and the Academic Parties are hereinafter referred to as **the Parties**.

2. THE SCIENCE MUSEUM CONTRIBUTION TO THE PROGRAMME

- 2.1 The Science Museum will deliver one optional module, Curating Science and Technology (the **Science Museum Module**), as part of the Programme and if you apply and are accepted onto the Science Museum Module, you will be required to attend the Science Museum premises on Exhibition Road, London, SW7 2DD to attend the Science Museum Module.
- 2.2 The regulatory framework relating to the assessment and examination of students on UCL's programmes of study, including, but not limited to, provisions for academic appeals, academic misconduct and extenuating circumstances (Assessment Regulations) of UCL, shall apply to the Science Museum Module and the Science Museum will mark the Science Museum Module in the UCL marking scale.
- 3. For the purposes of attending the Science Museum Module, you shall be required to register at the Science Museum as a visitor for the duration of the Science Museum Module, in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Science Museum that apply to visitors.

3. TUITION FEES

3.1 The modules provided by the Science Museum as part of your Programme are included in your tuition fees that you pay to UCL and you shall not be required to pay additional tuition fees to the Science Museum.

4. STUDENT COMPLAINTS AND DISCIPLINE

- 4.1 The UCL student complaints process will apply to any complaints you wish to raise relating to the Science Museum Module.
- 4.2 The UCL student conduct and discipline policies will apply to you even when you are attending the Science Museum premises for the purposes of the Science Museum Module.

5. USE OF PERSONAL DATA

- 1. You acknowledge that:
 - 5.1.1 each of UCL and the Science Museum holds, collects and uses information about its students (including prospective, current and former students) and visitors for academic, administrative, verification, management, pastoral and health and safety purposes; and
 - 5.1.2 when a student leaves UCL appropriate data is kept as a permanent record to enable UCL, if necessary, to provide references on a student's behalf, or to maintain a record of a student's achievements.
- 5.2 You hereby acknowledge that each of UCL or the Science Museum may pass and share your information with the other institution for the purposes of providing the Science Museum Module and the Programme. Further examples of data sharing and processing are available in the Science Museum Privacy Policy and the UCL General Student Privacy Notice. Each the Science Museum and UCL shall provide an up-to-date URL to enable access to their respective privacy notices on request.

INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

- 2. For the purposes of this Clause, **IPRs** means all and any copyright works, patents, discoveries, improvements, inventions, trade marks, designs, information, data, formulae, specifications, results of tests and field trials, diagrams, expertise, techniques, technology, know-how, and other intellectual property of any nature whatsoever, including applications and the right to apply for registration of any of the foregoing rights.
- 3. Ownership of any IPRs modified, conceived, created or developed by you in the course of studying on the Science Museum Module will be determined in accordance with the terms of the applicable student intellectual property policy in place at UCL unless otherwise agreed in writing by the Parties in respect of the Science Museum Module.

6. **CONFLICT**

- 1. You acknowledge that upon your acceptance of an offer of a place on the Programme, a contract is formed between you and UCL the terms of which comprise:
 - (1) the UCL standard student contract; and
 - (2) these terms and conditions; and

and you agree that in the event of conflict arising between (1) and (2) the terms of (2) shall prevail.

7. GOVERNING LAW

7.1 These terms and conditions, and any dispute or claim arising out of or in connection with their subject matter or formation (including non-contractual disputes or claims), shall be governed by, and construed in accordance with, English law, and the Parties irrevocably submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of England and Wales.
