### ADDITIONAL UCL STUDENT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

### 1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 University College London (UCL), Sorbonne Université on behalf of its Faculté de Sciences Pierre et Marie Curie (SORBONNE UNIVERSITÉ) and École Normale Supérieure (ENS) by an agreement dated 7 January 2019 (the Agreement) have agreed to provide a dual degree programme for appropriate students to work towards a degree of Master of Science in Brain and Minds Sciences awarded by UCL (the UCL Programme) and a degree of "Master de Science, Technologies, Santé, Mention Biologie Intégrative et Physiologie, parcours Neuroscience" awarded by Sorbonne Université (the SORBONNE UNIVERSITÉ/ENS Programme) (together the Dual Degree Programme).
- 1.2 The student (the **Student**) has applied to study for the Dual Degree Programme.
- 1.3 UCL, SORBONNE UNIVERSITÉ and ENS (the **Academic Parties**) have agreed to accept the Student onto the Dual Degree Programme on UCL's applicable student terms and conditions, and the additional UCL terms and conditions set out herein.
- 1.4 The Student and the Academic Parties are hereinafter referred to as the **Parties**.

### 2. **PROGRAMME DELIVERY**

- 2.1 The Student shall attend the premises of each of the Academic Parties according to the following timetable (as may be amended by agreement between the Academic Parties from time to time):
  - First year of the Dual Degree Programme (normally September to September) at UCL in London
  - Second year of the Dual Degree Programme (normally September to June at SORBONNE UNIVERSITÉ and ENS in Paris
- 2.2 The UCL awarded degree will be awarded to the Student by UCL upon successful completion of the UCL Programme. Only Students who have passed the UCL Programme will be allowed to progress to the SORBONNE UNIVERSITÉ/ENS Programme, i.e. the second year of the Dual Degree Programme.
- 2.3 The Student will be required to register as a student of UCL for the first year of the Dual Degree Programme (the UCL Programme), until (s)he has been awarded the UCL awarded degree. The Student will be required to register as a student of SORBONNE UNIVERSITÉ and ENS for the second year of the Dual Degree Programme (the SORBONNE UNIVERSITÉ/ENS Programme), until (s)he has been awarded the Sorbonne Université awarded degree. The Student will have access to

- each Academic Party's applicable facilities and learning resources for the duration of her/his registration with that Academic Party.
- 2.4 The regulatory framework of each Academic Party relating to the assessment and examination of students on each Academic Party's programmes of study, including provisions for academic appeals, academic misconduct and extenuating circumstances (**Assessment Regulations**), shall apply to the programme as follows:
  - 2.4.1 The Assessment Regulations of UCL shall apply to all modules delivered at UCL and to the UCL awarded degree as part of the Dual Degree Programme.
  - 2.4.2 The Assessment Regulations of SORBONNE UNIVERSITÉ and ENS shall apply to all modules delivered by SORBONNE UNIVERSITÉ and ENS and to the Sorbonne Université awarded degree as part of the Dual Degree Programme.

### 3. **FEES**

3.1 The Student shall pay the tuition fees for the first year of the Dual Degree Programme to UCL and the tuition fees for the second year of the Dual Degree Programme to SORBONNE UNIVERSITÉ in accordance with the relevant Academic Party's standard policies and processes relating to tuition fees.

# 4. ACADEMIC APPEALS, ACADEMIC MISCONDUCT AND STUDENT COMPLAINTS

- 4.1 Subject to the other provisions of this Clause 4, Students will be subject to the regulations, policies and procedures of UCL when studying at UCL and the regulations, policies and procedure of SORBONNE UNIVERSITÉ and ENS when studying at SORBONNE UNIVERSITÉ and ENS, including those related to student conduct, assessment, student discipline, complaints, academic appeals and attendance.
- 4.2 When Students are physically in attendance at one of the Academic Parties, those Students will be subject to the policies and procedures relating to the Students' physical attendance at that Academic Party, including, for example, health and safety, substance misuse and any other policies relating to safety, security, attendance and appropriate conduct at that Academic Party's premises. Any alleged breach of an Academic Party's policies and procedures or any such complaints will be dealt with by that Academic Party, in co-operation with the other Academic Parties as appropriate, in accordance with their respective policies, regulations and procedures, as amended from time to time.
- 4.3 Where the Student wishes to complain about any general aspect of the Dual Degree Programme (i.e. an aspect of the Dual Degree Programme not specific to either Academic Party), (s)he will be directed to invoke the complaints procedure of the

Academic Party where (s)he is in attendance, or has most recently been in attendance, at the time of the complaint. Where the Student wishes to complain about any specific service or facility provided by, or a student or member of staff from, one of the Academic Parties, the relevant complaints procedure of that Academic Party will apply.

4.4 If UCL or SORBONNE UNIVERSITÉ and ENS determines, in accordance with its own rules and regulations in respect of such matters, that the Student should not continue on the UCL Programme or the SORBONNE UNIVERSITÉ/ENS Programme for whatever reason then it shall so notify the other Academic Party. The Student acknowledges that the Academic Party making such determination shall have no further obligation to continue to allow or enable the particular Student to continue on the Dual Degree Programme.

### 5. **USE OF PERSONAL DATA**

- 5.1 The Student acknowledges that:
  - 5.1.1 each of UCL, SORBONNE UNIVERSITÉ and ENS holds, collects, uses, discloses and processes information about students on the Dual Degree Programme (including prospective, current and former students) for academic, administrative, verification, management, pastoral and health and safety purposes, as well as for any post course outcome survey and evaluation;
  - 5.1.2 when a student graduates from the Dual Degree Programme, appropriate data is kept as a permanent record to enable UCL, SORBONNE UNIVERSITÉ and ENS, if necessary, to provide references on a student's behalf, or to maintain a record of a student's achievements.
- In light of the information set out in paragraph 5.1 above, the Sudent hereby acknowledges and agrees that each of UCL, SORBONNE UNIVERSITÉ and ENS may pass and share the Student's information with the other institution and to other third parties (including any appointed agents or sub-contractors of UCL, SORBONNE UNIVERSITÉ and ENS in and out of the UK and France for the above purposes, and also in situations where the Student has given her/his consent, or where disclosure is required to meet a statutory obligation of the relevant institution (by way of example only, in the case of UCL, disclosure of information may be required to the Higher Education Statistics Agency). Further examples of data sharing and processing are available in the UCL General Student Privacy Notice. UCL shall provide an up-to-date URL to enable access to the UCL General Student Privacy Notice on request.
- 6. The Student acknowledges and agrees that by providing/confirming her/his information each of UCL, SORBONNE UNIVERSITÉ and ENS may hold, collect, use, disclose,

process and transfer such data as described in this paragraph 5. UCL will treat the Student's personal data in accordance with its General Student Privacy Notice and applicable data protection laws, including the General Data Protection Regulation and all applicable UK data protection legislation.

### 7. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

- 7.1 For the purposes of this Clause, **IPRs** means all and any copyright works, patents, discoveries, improvements, inventions, trade marks, designs, information, data, formulae, specifications, results of tests and field trials, diagrams, expertise, techniques, technology, know-how, and other intellectual property of any nature whatsoever, including applications and the right to apply for registration of any of the foregoing rights.
- 7.2 Ownership of any IPRs modified, conceived, created or developed by the Student in the course of studying on the Dual Degree Programme will be determined in accordance with the terms of the law of France for the second year of the Dual Degree Programme delivered by SORBONNE UNIVERSITÉ and ENS and the applicable student intellectual property policy in place at UCL for the first year of the Dual Degree Programme delivered by UCL.
- 7.3 Nothing in the Agreement and any applicable student intellectual property policy shall restrict the use by the Student of any research results, data, or other materials developed the course of the Dual Degree Programme, including any module, for the purpose of completing any assessment for the Dual Degree Programme and/or being assessed for either of the Awarded Degrees

# 8. **CONFLICT**

- 8.1 The Student acknowledges that upon acceptance of an offer of a place on the Dual Degree Programme by the Student, a contract is formed between UCL and the Student for the duration of the first year of the Dual Degree Programme (the UCL programme) the terms of which comprise:
  - (1) the UCL Standard Student Contract;
  - (2) these terms and conditions; and

and the Student agrees that in the event of conflict arising between (1) and (2) the provisions of (2) shall prevail.

#### 9. **GOVERNING LAW**

9.1 These terms and conditions, and any dispute or claim arising out of or in connection with their subject matter or formation (including non-contractual disputes or claims),

shall be governed by, and construed in accordance with English law, and the Parties irrevocably submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of England and Wales.
