ADDITIONAL UCL STUDENT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 University College London (UCL) and Beijing Jiaotong University (BJTU) (the Academic Parties) by an agreement dated 19 July 2018 (the Agreement) have agreed for appropriate students registered on a relevant master's degree programme at BJTU (BJTU Programme) to be able to apply to undertake the UCL degree programme of Master of Science in Urban Railways (UCL Programme) while registered on their master's programme at BJTU.
- 1.2 The UCL Programme and BJTU programme together shall be known as the **Dual Degree Programme.**
- 1.3 You have applied to UCL to study on the UCL Programme and UCL has offered you a place to study on the UCL Programme subject to the standard UCL student terms and conditions and these additional UCL student terms and conditions relating to your specific programme of study.

2. **ADMINISTRATION**

- 2.1 Subject to the other provisions of these additional UCL student terms and conditions, you will be subject to the regulations, policies and procedures of UCL when studying on the UCL Programme at UCL and BJTU when studying on the BJTU Programme at BJTU, including those related to assessment, student discipline, academic appeals and attendance.
- 2.2 You will be registered as a student on interrupted status at BJTU for the duration of the UCL Programme, in accordance with the rules and regulations of BJTU. If you have to extend your registration on the UCL Programme for any reason, including but not limited to resitting failed assessment and deferring assessment due to extenuating circumstances, in accordance with the relevant UCL regulations, you can apply to extend your interrupted status at BJTU in accordance with the relevant BJTU regulations.

3. STUDENT COMPLAINTS

3.1 If you wish to complain about any general aspect of the Dual Degree programme (i.e. an aspect of the Dual Degree programme not specific to either Academic Party), you will be directed to invoke the complaints procedure of the Academic Party where you are in attendance, or were most recently in attendance, at the time of the complaint. If you wish to complain about any specific service or facility provided by, or a student or member of staff from, one of the Academic Parties, the relevant complaints procedure of that Academic Party will apply.

4. **USE OF PERSONAL DATA**

4.1 You acknowledge that:

- 4.1.1 each of UCL and BJTU holds, collects and uses information about its students (including prospective, current and former students) for academic, administrative, verification, management, pastoral and health and safety purposes; and
- 4.1.2 when a student leaves UCL and BJTU, appropriate data is kept as a permanent record to enable UCL and BJTU, if necessary, to provide references on a student's behalf, or to maintain a record of a student's achievements.
- 4.2 You hereby acknowledge that each of UCL and BJTU may pass and share your information with the other institution and to other third parties (including any appointed agents or subcontractors of UCL or BJTU) for the purposes of providing the Dual Degree Programme.

5. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

- 5.1 For the purposes of this Clause, **IPRs** means all and any copyright works, patents, discoveries, improvements, inventions, trade marks, designs, information, data, formulae, specifications, results of tests and field trials, diagrams, expertise, techniques, technology, know-how, and other intellectual property of any nature whatsoever, including applications and the right to apply for registration of any of the foregoing rights.
- 5.2 Ownership of any IPRs modified, conceived, created or developed by you in the course of studying on any module on the UCL Programme will be determined in accordance with the terms of the applicable student intellectual property policy in place at UCL and ownership of any IPRs modified, conceived, created or developed by you in the course of studying on any module on the BJTU Programme will be determined in accordance with the terms of the applicable student intellectual property policy in place at BJTU.

6. CONFLICT

6.1 You acknowledge that upon acceptance of an offer of a place on the UCL Programme, a contract is formed between you and UCL for the duration of the UCL Programme the terms of which comprise:

(1) the UCL standard student contract; and

(2) these terms and conditions; and

you agree that in the event of conflict arising between (1) and (2), the terms of (2) shall prevail.

7. GOVERNING LAW

7.1 These terms and conditions, and any dispute or claim arising out of or in connection with their subject matter or formation (including non-contractual disputes or claims), shall be governed by, and construed in accordance with, English law, and the Parties irrevocably submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of England and Wales.
