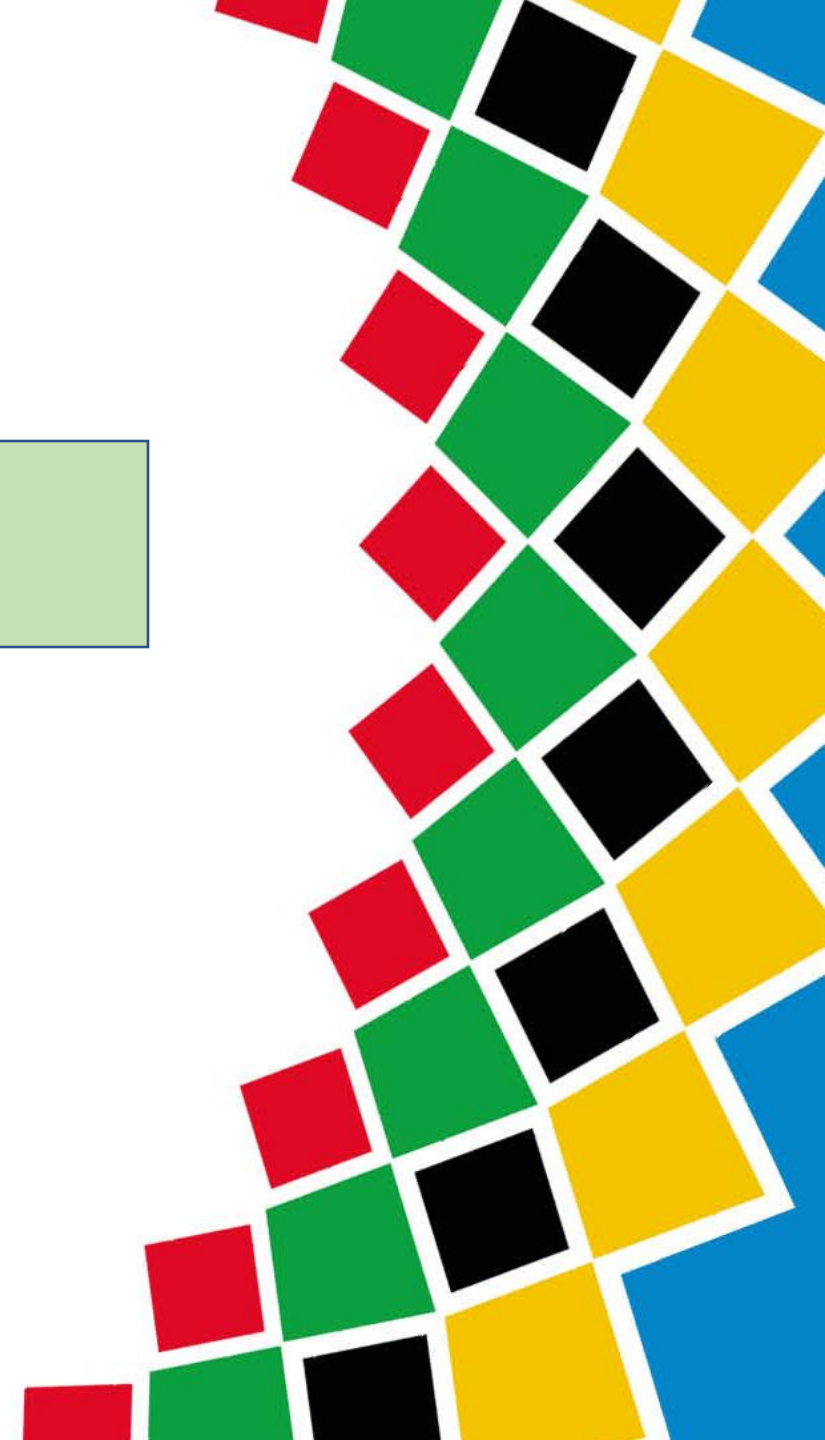

- The six London boroughs hosting the games – Barking and Dagenham, Greenwich, Hackney, Newham, Tower Hamlets and Waltham Forest.
- The UK won the bid and the regeneration cost approximately £10 billion.
- The regeneration of Stratford was aimed to have an overall positive impact with new affordable houses, a better economy and a sustainable environment.

Physical Education

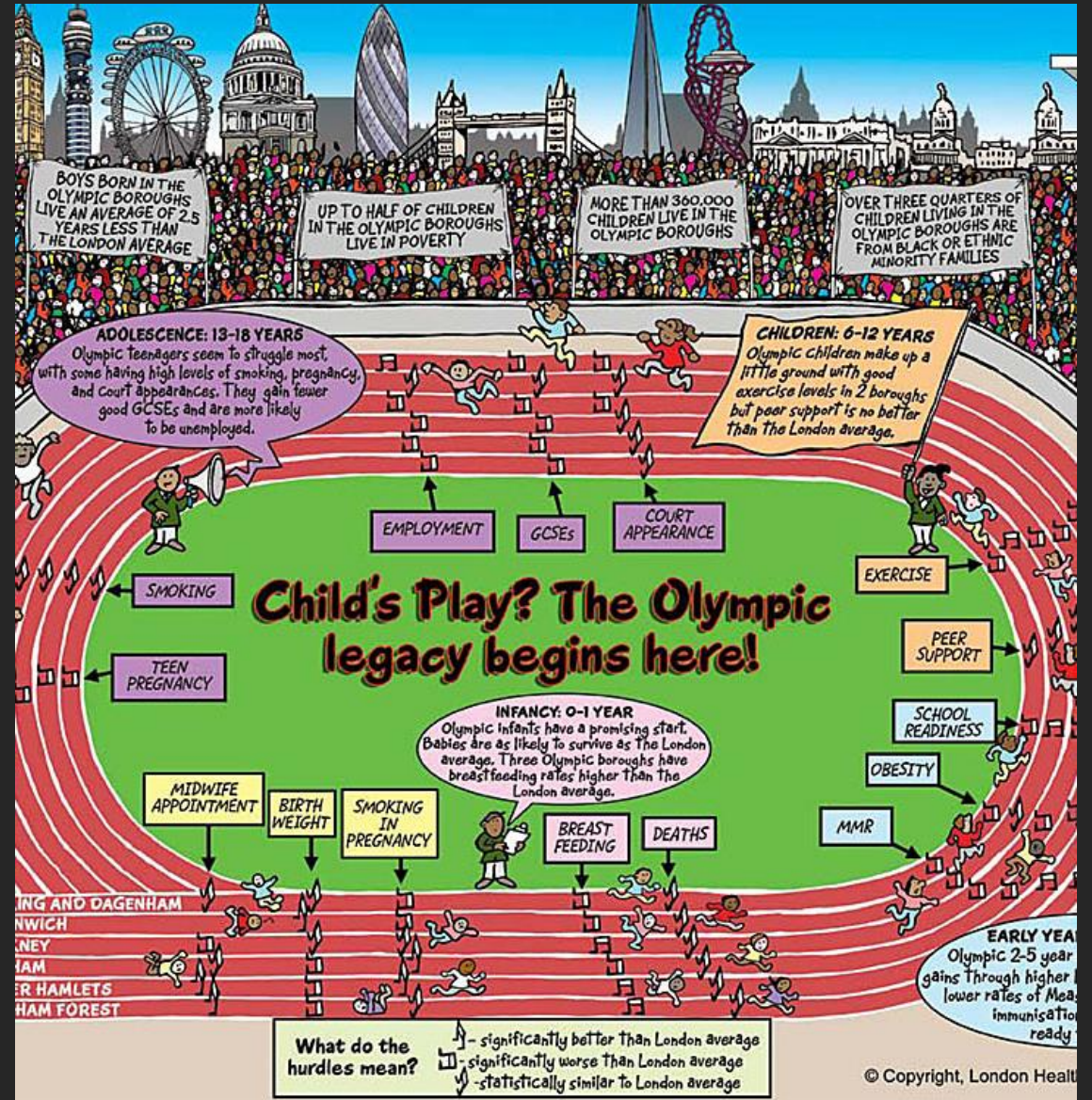
Sporting

- Treated as cheap labour 'just another pair of hands'.



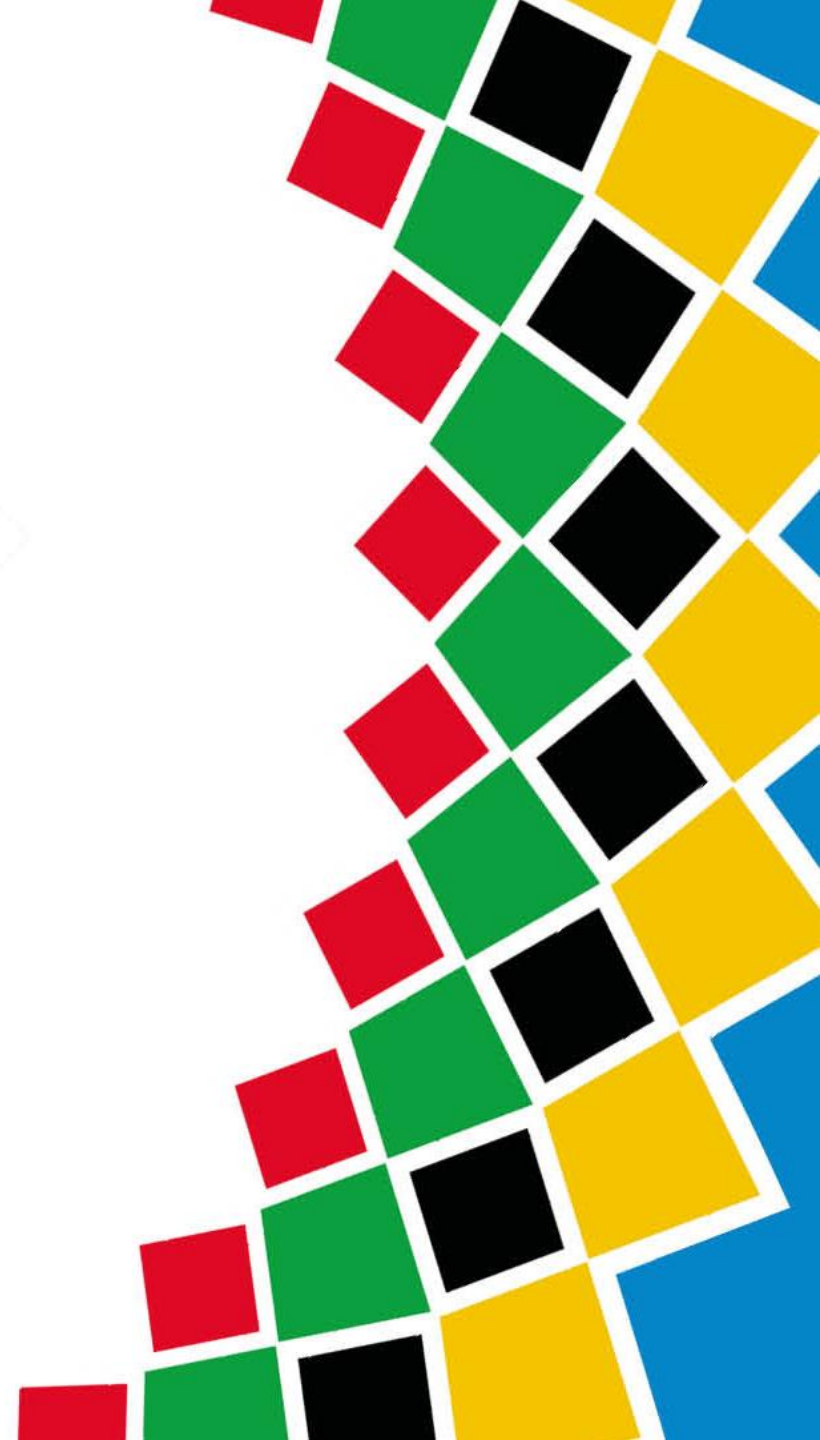
